19, SAT.		<p>Please note: Day-by-day schedules and travel times are always subject to change to accommodate rehearsals, performances and sightseeing as well as local weather and traffic conditions. Concerts will NOT be arranged until September 2010.</p> <p>PENSACOLA/ENROUTE: Depart Pensacola on Delta Airline’s overnight flight to Madrid via a connection in Atlanta.</p> <p>19 MAR DELTA AIRLINES 1307 PENSACOLA/ATLANTA 11:55A – 2:09P 19 MAR DELTA AIRLINES 108 ATLANTA/MADRID 6:55P - 8:35A (20 MAR)</p>
20, SUN.		<p>MADRID: Upon arrival and after customs formalities, meet the waiting Intropa Tours tour manager and motor coach. Transfer to the hotel for check in.</p> <p>Board the motor coach for a panorama tour of the city. The capital of Spain is a multi-faceted city with one of the greatest art collections in the world and a population of over 3 ½ million people. Continue to the hotel for check-in via a panoramic tour to acquaint you with the city. Balance of the day at leisure for independent shopping and sightseeing. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.</p>
21, MON.		<p>MADRID: Breakfast at the hotel.</p> <p>Morning sightseeing tour including the Retiro, Madrid’s prettiest park. Once a royal retreat, the park is home to La Rosaleda (a beautiful rose garden) and many statues and fountains. The tour continues to the Puerta del Sol or “Gate of the Sun”, which is literally the center of Spain as all kilometer distances for the country are measured from the zero marker in front of the Police Headquarters. The tour will end at the Prado Museum, a collection of works by artists such as Velazquez, Murillo, El Greco and Goya.</p> <div data-bbox="1177 1281 1539 1549" data-label="Image"> </div> <p>Continue to El Escorial to visit the Royal Monastery-Palace and the Valley of the Fallen, which was built by order of General Franco and inaugurated by the Generalissimo as a dedication to the Unknown Soldier of the Spanish Civil War. Built into the mountainside, this Basilica has a huge granite cross on the top which is 500 feet high and 150 feet across. This is one of the focal points of the area and a landmark in the Guaderrma Mountains.</p> <div data-bbox="1230 1675 1544 1879" data-label="Image"> </div> <p><u>PERFORMANCE</u> in Madrid. Dinner and overnight in Madrid.</p>

22, TUE.

MADRID/SEGOVIA: Buffet breakfast at the hotel. Board the motor coach.

Full day excursion to Segovia. An important military town during the Roman Empire, this town has a site which is often compared to a ship, for the city center seems to lie on a triangular rock with the Roman Aqueduct to the left and cathedral domes and spires to the right. Sites of this town include Alcazar, a 14th century building which lies at the merging of the Eresma and Clamores Rivers; the Cathedral, the massive golden stone building built during the reign of King Charles V; El Parral Monastery; and the Roman Aqueduct, which is still operational today. Return to Madrid for dinner and overnight.



23, WED.

MADRID/SALAMANCA: Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

Morning departure for Salamanca. Thanks to its Renaissance sandstone buildings, Salamanca received the nickname *La Ciudad Dorada* ("The golden city"). This golden glow is unique in Spain and is due to the "Villamayor Stone", a type of sandstone coming from a quarry situated in Villamayor, a village close to Salamanca. The city is large enough to be able to offer the advantages of a large city, but at the same time it keeps the intimacy of a village. In Salamanca, the inhabitants speak the "purest" Spanish in Spain - Castilian. For this reason Salamanca is enormously popular with people all over the world who want to learn Spanish.

Check in at the hotel for dinner and overnight in Salamanca.

24, THU.

SALAMANCA/BURGOS: Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

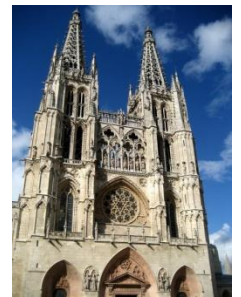
Enjoy a panoramic city tour of Salamanca.

Departure for Burgos.

The birthplace of Rodrigo Diaz de Vivar aka "El Cid", Burgos was founded in 884 and is a monumental town, charming for that so typical medieval northern Castilian ambience. The gothic cathedral is all dominant, but there are many important monuments such as the Cartuja de Miraflores, the 15th century church specially noted for the tombs of Juan II and Doña Maria, and the Puerta de Santa Maria, the 16th century door of the town with a 14th century Arabian-style tower, "Torre de Santa Maria" at its side.

Hotel check in, dinner and overnight.



25, FRI.

BURGOS/ZARAGOZA: Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

After a panoramic tour of Burgos, travel to Zaragoza, one of the great monumental towns in Spain. Founded over 2000 years ago, the city is rich in Roman and Arabic heritage and is the culminant point in the valley of Ebro, Spain's most water-bearing river. On arrival, enjoy a sightseeing tour featuring the Basilica de Nuestra Senora del Piar (Holy irgin of the Pilar),

one of the most popular places of pilgrimage in all Spain. Construction of the Baroque building was begun in 1681, although parts were added in later periods. The interior includes works of Goya and Bayeau and the church's museum houses a large collection of religious arts. The tour will also include the Gothic Cathedral de la Seo, built in the 14th century over an older Romanesque temple. After the tour, check in at the hotel for dinner and overnight.

26, SAT.

ZARAGOZA/BARCELONA: Buffet breakfast at the hotel. Enjoy a panoramic city tour of Zaragoza. Continue on to Barcelona. Barcelona is Spain's second largest and most cosmopolitan city. The citizens are almost militant in the use of their own language - with street names, newspapers and radio programs all in Catalan. Barcelona hosted the 1992 Olympic Games and is home to the Picasso Museum. Check-in at the hotel for dinner and overnight.

27, SUN.

BARCELONA: Breakfast at the hotel. Board the motor coach for a city tour of Barcelona. Morning sightseeing tour including the Placa de la Seu, with the Gothic cathedral and the Placa del Rei, the embodiment of the Gothic Quarter. The Salo de Tinell, a magnificent banqueting hall built in 1362, is thought to have been the place where Columbus was received by the Catholic kings when he first returned from America. Remainder of the afternoon at leisure for independent shopping and sightseeing. Evening **PERFORMANCE**. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.



28, MON.

BARCELONA: Breakfast at the hotel. Morning sightseeing of the Old Town, traversed by Barcelona's most famous avenue, the Ramblas, is one of the most extensive and harmonious medieval city centers in Europe. The Barri Gotic contains the cathedral and ancient royal palace. Adjoining is La Ribera, full of 14th century mansions, one of which is occupied by the Picasso Museum. The entire area is bounded by the beautiful City Park which contains the Museum of Modern Art and the zoo. The revitalized beach area has reclaimed the seafront, which stretches from the modern Olympic Village to the Old Port and the historic shipyards, a fashionable marina and promenade. Dinner and overnight in Barcelona.



29, TUE.

BARCELONA/PENSACOLA: Small boxed breakfast provided by the hotel. Departure for Pensacola via a connection in Atlanta.
